Evidence of the Plagues of Egypt

When working with a class, I advise setting up a point system. It would help if you thought about charging parents a fee for the class, and those fees go toward the kids' prizes for the top three who earn the most points. You can also use this as a ministry opportunity and absorb the costs. An idea of a reward prize could be a book of interest in the subjects you are learning together to start their library with a gift card.

The point system is a powerful tool for fostering learning and goal orientation. I've observed students becoming more engaged, taking notes, and memorizing facts. This system encourages them to set goals and work towards achieving them.

After each video, I questioned them about what they had learned the previous day. At the end of each video, I asked what they had learned for points.
